




MAP OF ASSYRIAN CONQUESTS





For the Jewish people, the Babylonian Captivity brought much sorrow and some hard feelings.


Psalm 137: "By the rivers of Babylon— there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our harps. For there our captors asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!" How could we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land? If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand wither! Let my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth, if I do not remember you, if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy. Remember, O Lord, against the Edomites the day of Jerusalem's fall, how they said, "Tear it down! Tear it down! Down to its foundations!" O daughter Babylon, you devastator! Happy shall they be who pay you back what you have done to us! Happy shall they be who take your babies and dash them against the rock!"

During the Babylonian Exile, the Jewish people had to rethink their belief system. This rethinking led to the emergence of synagogues and rabbis.


Persian Empire & Judah

- Persian Empire; capital: Susa
- Judah (the southern Kingdom); capital: Jerusalem



2nd Temple - King Cyrus

 "Thus says Cyrus king of Persia: The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, and he has charged me to build him a house at Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever is among you of all his people, may his God be with him, and let him go up to Jerusalem, which is in Judah, and rebuild the house of the LORD (Ezra 1:14)



During the Greek era - Hanukkah (165 BCE)

- Both the Hellenic dynasties, first the Ptolemies based in Egypt and the Seleucids - based in Syria, allowed Judea to be self ruled as a tributary state
- But Antiochus IV (175-164 BCE) wanted the Jewish people to worship the Greek Gods
- To that end he initiated pressure and persecutions that resulted in local revolutions
- Jews resisted and won due to their dedication ... (Hanukkah)

Second Temple Destroyed

Roman Control:

- Jews revolted in 66AD
- Second Temple destroyed by Titus (Romans) in 70 AD
- Romans forced the Jewish people to leave-Jewish diaspora
- The Wailing Wall remains




Jewish Diaspora and again Persian support...



Romans vs Persians - two superpowers (for centuries)






